*Confession of Faith

In the gospel age neither prayer nor any other part of worship is made more acceptable to God by the place in which it is performed, or towards which it is directed; rather, God is to be worshipped everywhere, in spirit and in truth.

God is to be worshipped daily by families together, as well as by each member in secret; and with greater solemnity in the public assemblies for worship, which are not to be carelessly neglected or willfully forsaken when God, by his Word or providence, calls for them.

It is the law of nature in general that a due portion of time be set apart for the worship of God. But God has in his Word more particularly appointed one day in seven as a Sabbath, to be kept holy unto him, as a positive, moral, and perpetual commandment binding all men in all ages.

This Sabbath, from the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ, was the last day of the week. But with the resurrection of Christ, the Sabbath was changed to the first day of the week, which in Scripture is called "The Lord's Day," and is to be continued to the end of the world as the Christian Sabbath.

The Sabbath is kept holy to the Lord when men, after preparing their hearts and ordering their affairs beforehand, observe a holy rest all the day from their own works, words, and thoughts about their worldly employments and recreations,

And when they make use of the whole day for the public and private exercises of God's worship, and for the duties of necessity and mercy.
